The Golden Plains Middle School football team won their second game of the season at home against Triplains/Brewster on September 11. The visiting Titans won the kick but the Bulldog defense forced them to punt. AJ Camacho was tackled in the backfield on the first play but broke through the line on the next for his first touchdown of the game. The Titans stopped the PAT attempt and the Bulldogs were up 6-0.

After getting the ball back once again from the Titans, the Bulldogs wasted no time advancing down the field with a carry by Caleb Korte and another Camacho touchdown.
