MS Boys Place Fifth at Rawlins County Jamie Graves

The Golden Plains Middle School boys set a new school record as they scored 49 points earning them fifth place at the Rawlins County Invitational on April 21.

Eight grader Dylan Wark set a new school record of 30.26 in the 200m hurdles placing first at the meet. He broke the record of 30.67 set by Isaac Broeckelman in 2006. "It's about time!" said Broeckelman. "I wish him the best and hope he can break it several more times." Wark also placed first in the 800 meter dash with a time of 2:27.68, first in the 100m hurdles at 16.66 and third in high jump with a PR jump of 5' 0".

Also performing well was eighth grader Diego Perez. Perez placed first in the 1600m dash with a time of 5:44.31 and first in Triple Jump with a PR of 36' 11.75". He placed second in the 400m dash running it with a PR time of 1:00.24, and placing fourth in the long jump with a jump of 15'0".

Seventh grader Roberto Araux placed in several events including second in the 200m dash with a PR time of 28:32, third in the 200m hurdles with a PR time of 32.27, and just missing out on points in seventh place of the 100m dash with a PR of 14.12 and eighth in the 100m hurdles PR of 20.18.

Eighth grader Zeke Weiner placed third in the 3200m dash with a time of 14:01.08 earning the Bulldogs points.
