May 3 is the deadline to apply for the June 8 ACT test. This test is an important one for juniors or sophomores who are trying to improve scores so they can take college classes in high school or get scholarships for college. Go to <u>my.act.org</u> to register. If you do not have an account, you will need to set one up. You may be able to take it for free. Check with your counselor to see if you qualify for a fee waiver.

The University of Kansas is offering residential summer camps for high school students interested in a career in STEM - totally free of charge. We are looking for current sophomores and juniors (rising juniors and seniors) who are interested in math, physics, aerospace engineering, and computer science for this opportunity. Our camps offer the chance for students to get hands-on experience in these fields, working with innovative researchers and scientists on emerging disciplines like AI and drones. Campers can envision future careers while exploring college life and studies in a safe and fun environment.
